West Virginia Farmers Market Nutrition Program (WVFMNP)- Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) & Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

ALL vendors who wish to be involved in the West Virginia Farmers Market Nutrition Program, MUST complete the online training for 2026. Even if you have completed training last year, you are REQUIRED to complete the online training in 2026. In the past you were required to accept vouchers for both the SFMNP and WIC programs, however due to MANY changes with the programs you must complete an application for each program that you wish to participate in. Please note that to accept the WIC benefits you must have Internet connectivity at the location you accept the benefits as the benefits will be assigned to the participant and redeemed by the farmer via Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT).

Steps for Program Participation\*

Assurance of Civil Rights is a required agreement, which with signature, indicates you will follow the Civil Rights as outlined. This should be completed after watching the Civil Rights video. Vendor Verification Form must be completed in its entirety to be considered for the program. If you purchase produce from other vendors, you must list who you purchase from, as well as their physical address and telephone number. Remember, all purchases must be made within 50 miles of the West Virginia state border. Vendors may be required to provide mileage for verification.
